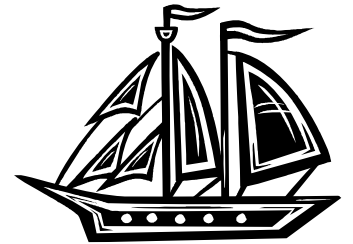

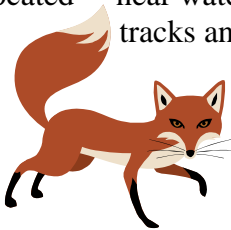


Autumn Fox Baiting



At present there appears to be an increase in fox numbers throughout the district, with young foxes dispersing from their breeding areas, therefore landholders across the Eyre Peninsula area are being encouraged to take part in Autumn fox baiting. Recent local spotlight surveys have indicated that foxes seem to be on the increase so now is a good time to bait to reduce overall fox numbers before the winter breeding season.

Autumn baiting focuses on the widespread movement of foxes into new territories and wider search for food. Bait stations located near water points, vegetated areas, farm tracks and dead livestock tend to be the most effective.

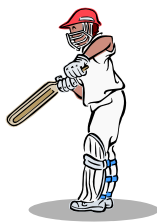
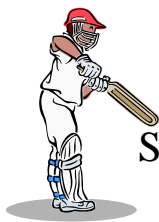

WiseMove - A Program for Wise Mums

WiseMove, an initiative of the South Australian Government and the Office for Recreation and Sport, encourages mothers with young children to look after themselves, to be active and feel good about it. The program will help mothers understand that physical activity can benefit themselves, their parenting and their relationships.

WiseMove is seven-week program that is designed to help women incorporate physical activity into their lives. Weekly sessions are devoted to topics such as stress management, motivation, healthy eating, personal safety, goal setting and body comfort. Each session has an hour of discussion followed by an hour of physical activity.

Walking is the main form of activity in this program; however, two weeks of the program can be used to introduce participants to new activities like tai chi or Yoga.

A mother always wants to give her best, but to do that she needs to be at *her* best. Including some form of physical activity into the daily schedule can put mums on the right track.

Mid West Community Health wants to help women stay healthy while juggling all of the demands of motherhood. They will be offering the WiseMove program in **Elliston** starting **7th Feb. 2012** and running through to **20th March** No previous experience is required.
